Prayer for Illumination

God who calls us and challenges us: be present to us as we listen to your word. We wonder about your meaning for our lives and your intention for our world. Help us to hear with new ears the way in which you would have us live with our neighbours in every part of this wonderful world.

One possible reflection based on 2 scripture passages

Reading 1: Samuel 3: 1-10

Reading 2: John 6:8-11 (Loaves and fishes)

Reflection:

The story of God calling the child Samuel is well known.

A child whose mother had prayed for his existence and when he is weaned she takes him to the temple and dedicates him to God's work under the authority of the priest Eli.

Today we would be horrified that a mother would do such a thing but this was her way of thanking God for giving her this child.

He's a bit older now and in the night he hears his name being called. "Samuel, Samuel". Who could it be other than the priest? 3 times he gets up and runs to the priest. But it is not the priest calling – it is the voice of God with a message for Samuel.

Today our focus is on children and how God is calling us through them.

Let's start with this child. Who can tell me his name or something about him?

Remember how it went viral and Canadians were moved to respond. Since 2015 more than 750 United Church congregations have sponsored Syrian refugees.

Here is a child throwing a stone at a tank.



Imagine the imbalance here – the futility of the child's act, the imbalance of power between the Israeli military and school children.

And here is a boy who lives in the Aida Refugee Camp in Bethlehem.



All these children are vehicles of God's call to us. Might God be saying: "Canada, you can make a difference. People of Canada, speak to your government."

Outsiders can have an influence on the actions of the government of Israel. For the past several months many groups across Canada have supported and signed a Parliamentary e-petition

asking the government to appoint a special envoy to investigate what is happening to Palestinian children and to report back to the Canadian Parliament.

On November 27, 2020 M.P. Paul Manly will present this petition to Parliament. People across Canada can support this request by urging their own member of Parliament to join and support this call for action for Palestinian children's rights.

One more story from our sacred scriptures – John 6: 8-11. First the context. Jesus is out in the wilderness with a large crowd. He knows the people need something to eat. He asks his disciples "Where can we buy enough food to feed all these people". Well, Philip was the practical type and he knew that was an impossibility - more than could be done.

Andrew – though – had an idea. "There is a boy here who has five loaves of barley bread and two fish. But they will certainly not be enough for all these people."

And – I imagine you know the results – the meager offering multiplied and all were fed.

In Palestine, the occupying Israeli military is arresting Palestinian children. Against international law the children are interrogated without a lawyer or parent present and taken out of Palestine and held in custody in Israel. They are also tried in military courts without the minimum safeguards required for a fair trial.

Imagine being the parent of a child taken away in the middle of the night. Imagine the sense of helplessness of the family. Imagine how the child loses faith in the parents' ability to protect them. Imagine the soldiers threatening the child that their parents will be harmed if the child doesn't confess to whatever crime they are being charged with.

The children of Palestine are looking to us, calling us. We too wonder what you and I can do to give these children the best chance at enjoying their childhood and growing to contribute to the well-being of the world.
